SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM: Criteria for Scholarship Program 1. A person going into Marine Science/Biology, Conservation, Conservation Law Enforcement (DEC), or a related field. 2. If none of the above are applied for, then no scholarship will be given for that year. 3. A total of \$2,000 will be awarded yearly by an independent committee. 4. How scholarships will be awarded. Must be: a) a Western New York resident b) a person going into one of the above fields 5. Eligibility, must be: a) a senior in high school\*- or b) an incoming student the following semester - or c) already enrolled in a college or university. 6. Applicant must submit a 250-500 word essay on how they plan to help their field once they have received their degree. Essays will be judged by an independent committee. 7. This scholarship money will be available yearly.\* Note: Proof of college or university acceptance in an approved field must accompany the application of a senior in high school.
